

This is an opportunity for members of the parish to participate in a ministry to make this possible by underrighting the cost. The cost of these books is \$30.00. Today's Music

We enter worship today singing the grand Welsh melody, *Cwm Rhondda*, composed by John Hughes for a 1903 singing festival. The words were written by Harry Emerson Fosdick while at his summer home in Boothbay Harbor and sung the following October 5, 1930 at the opening of Riverside Church, New York City. So, stand up straight, hold up your hymnals, take a deep breath and sing with gusto!

The sequence hymn, Jesus came adored by angels, has gentle music written by Gerald Near (American, b. 1942). The offertory hymn, Come, thou fount of every blessing, with text written by Robert Robinson (English, 1735-1790) has been paired with the early 19th century folk-hymn, Nettleton. During communion we sing William Cowper's (English, 1731-1800) text paired with another early American tune, Light, which first appeared in publication in 1831. Cowper was absolutely right on target when he stated Sometimes a light surprises the Christian while he sings(!) (underscoring mine). Why are we singing an Advent hymn now? Our dismissal hymn with Charles Wesley's (English, 1707-1788) expansive text touches on all of today's lessons as well as pointing us towards approaching Advent. We sing it paired with the music of John Francis Wade (English, 1711-1786).

The Choir sings an anthem to encourage us in our season of stewardship: the text from the Book of Tobit



says volumes in just one sentence! Christopher Tye (English, 1505?-1573), composer, organist at Ely Cathedral wrote the music for this text. Tye later was ordained and returned to Ely Cathedral as priest.

May you be blessed with insightful surprises as you sing today!
