

Today's Music

It is not a typo that I play three different composers settings of the German chorale, *Vater unser in Himmelreich*; and then another one during communion! You can find this strong hymn, a paraphrase of *The Lord's Prayer*, in our hymnal at#575(text also at #574, but with a different tune). This tune is not so familiar to us; however, Bach used this tune in his *St. John Passion* as well as cantatas 90, 101 and 102, and organ chorales and Mendelssohn based his *Sixth Organ Sonata* on this tune. **Michael Praetorius** (Thuringia, Germany, 1571-1621) was born Michael Schultz: *Prae-*

torius was the Latinized version of the name, Schultz! He is not known to be related to the composers Hieronymous Praetorius (1560-1629) nor his son, Jacob Praetorius (1586-1651) who were both from Hamburg in northern Germany.

Michael was a prolific composer, who is probably best known to us today as the harmonizer of the 14th/15th century carol, Lo, how a Rose e'er blooming (Hymnal #81). Dietrich Buxtehude (Danish, 1637-1707), famed as organist (Bach is reputed to have walked 200 miles to hear him play) was also a prolific composer of church music, including cantatas, arias, concertos and organ music. Marcel Dupré (French, 1886-1971) was organist, composer and a gifted improviser. Gerald Near (American, b. 1942) is a church musician who also happens to be a prolific composer, especially of organ and choral sacred music. I find his organ music, based on chorales or plainchant, very well-crafted and fresh.

The Choir sings a paraphrase of *Canticle B*, one of the many supplemental materials written after our 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* was printed. **Patricia B. Clark**'s (b. 1938) paraphrase from Chapter 51 of the Book of Ecclesiasticus/Sirach (from The *Apocrypha*, so your Bible at home may not have it) was set to music by **Thomas Pavlechko** (b.1962).

I just discovered that Pavlechko composed this tune while he was at the Summer 1996 **Master Schola** at The Community of Jesus, Orleons, MA: I was there, too (!) as one of the 50 participants that Summer working on Bach's *St. John Passion* with Stephen Cleobury of King's College, Cambridge. The world gets smaller and smaller!

Today's summer hymn request is Hymn #695, By gracious powers so wonderfully sheltered. This is a paraphrase of the last poem written by Dietrich Bonhoeffer (German, 1906-1945) while in a Gestapo prison. The poem was found in a letter dated December 28, 1944, addressed to his mother for her birthday. Bonhoeffer lived with the fear of death; indeed he was executed a few months after writing this poem. It is a moving expression of faith coming out of the horrors of World War II. We sing it to the music by Sir Hubert H. Parry (English, 1848-1918) who, in addition to being a prolific composer, especially of church music (his ashes are

buried in the crypt at St. Paul's Cathedral) was a renaissance man who was a squire, magistrate, author, amateur scientist, diarist, critic, yachtsman and involved in the compilation of the *Dictionary of Music and Musicians* (*The "Grove's Dictionary"*). In our *Hymnal 1940* we sang this tune to the words of the poet, John Greenleaf Whittier, *O brother man, fold to thy heart thy brother*.

Go forth with a song in your heart.
