#### **Crèche Razing**

#### Confirmation

**Confirmation classes will be offered beginning February 4**. Confirmation classes teach about our faith—not only our Christian faith, but also about our identity as Episcopalians.

Years ago, the tradition in the Episcopal Church was to confirm children in the fifth grade. After confirmation the new confirmand would be allowed to take communion and it was understood that this signified the end of their "childhood" in church.

Christian educators over the years increased the age of confirmation to the 6th and then 7th grade, but to the educators it was becoming increasingly apparent that the students were becoming confirmed because it was what their parents wished, rather than as a mature affirmation of faith. Many students stopped attending Sunday school after confirmation, and some even stopped attending church. It was as if they had "graduated" from church after confirmation.


For the past couple of decades, Episcopal churches in the U.S. have been increasing the age at which children are confirmed. Confirmation classes have become geared to students who have "differentiated" from their parents as part of their normal stages of development. Youth directors began to see that students became personally invested in their confirmation classes once they had reached this stage. The later students began confirmation classes, the more invested in their faith they became. Priests and lay educators noticed that the rate of students remaining in church after their confirmation increased dramatically as a result.

I will be offering Confirmation to our youth who are in the ninth grade or above beginning on February 4. The class will meet after the 9:30 service for approximately 30 minutes, and will continue weekly until Holy Week. Confirmation is scheduled for April 15 when the Bishop comes for his annual visitation. If there are any adults who would like to be confirmed, please contact me at rector@stthomascmdenme.org

#### **Today's Music**

Where is The Choir?<sup>®</sup> On sabbatical! A few years ago I realized that we were one of the only choirs that sang **year round! That's 52 Sundays, plus holidays, for an unpaid, volunteer choir!** So, I instituted a choir sabbatical for the time during Epiphany just before we go into Lent.! We will return to our Thursday rehearsals (5:00-6:30 pm) on February 1, 2018 and our Sunday morning rehearsals (8:30-9:10 am) on February 4, 2018. When you get a chance, please thank a choir member for their time, hard work, showing up, and for singing with joy!

Sir Charles Hubert Hastings Parry (English, 1848-1918) was a prolific composer of church music, anthems, songs, oratorios, instrumental compositions as well as hymns (see #597 *Jerusalem*, #653 *Reston* and #432 *Laudate Dominum*) in our hymnal). He also wrote 2 sets of chorale preludes for organ and today I play one of those as the prelude.

During communion I play the contemporary American composer Robert Hobby's chorale prelude based on this same tune, *Rockingham*. Then we sing this hymn with the Eucharistic text, *My God, thy table now is spread*. We are still in Epiphany, so indulge me as I play Marcel Dupre's haunting setting of *In dulci jubilant*.

We enter worship singing the sturdy Welsh tune, *Ton-y-Botel* with the contemporary text written in 1954 as a processional hymn for commencement at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

We go forth into the world singing the vibrant 1566 German tune, *Mit Freuden Zara (or Bohemian Brethren)* paired with Johann Jacob Schutz's 17th century uplifting text. Then I play Johann Sebastian Bach's piece based on *Jesus, all my gladness.*
