

Noon Music in Lent

Our Noon Music in Lent program concludes this coming Friday, March 23 with music by our own Jane Schroeder and Suzanne Scott. Come and hear them perform a half hour of music, then enjoy fellowship and a lunch of soup and bread in the Parish Hall. The free-will offering benefits the Camden Area Christian Food Pantry.

Today's Music

I love the richness and depth of our lessons today. The Collect points this out "Almighty God, you alone can bring into order the unruly wills and affections of sinners....among the swift and varied changes of the world, our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found." (a message full of hope for us!). I have endeavored to choose music which brings out this message. John Bowring's hymn, In the Cross of Christ I glory (first published in 1825) was inspired by the sight of the cross on the west wall of Our Lady of Fatima, perched on the highest hill of Macao. The church had been destroyed in repeated attacks: but the blackened cross remained. Ithamar Conkey (I did not make up his name) composed the tune for this text in 1849 and named it (Rathbun) for his soprano soloist!

The sequence hymn, Glory be to Jesus, an Italian text from the 18th century, is a moving devotional text on the crucified Christ. The music by Friedrich Filitz (German, 1804-1860) is simple, but by no means dumb, with its use of the first six notes of the scale of F (one exception when the Altos get to sing that lovely C#). Robert A. Hobby (American, b. 1962) expanded on this tune for today's postlude. During communion we sing F. Pratt Green's contemporary text, written at the request of the British composer Francis Westbrook, who stated "I am haunted by the almost unearthly beauty of Tallis's The Third Tune, set to some impossible words by Addison in The English Hymnal.Can you try your hand at three verses?" Green (British, 1903-2000) certainly rose to the occasion! Thomas Tallis (English, 1505-1585) served under four Tudor monarchs; amazing, since he did not hide his Roman Catholic faith. Tallis was a prolific composer. He composed The Third Tune for Matthew Parker's setting of Psalm 2 in The Whole Psalter translated into English Metre (1567 -68). Here is the original text:

Why fumeth in sight: the Gentile's spite, in fury raging stout?

Why taketh in hand: the people fond, vain things to bring about?

The kings arise: the lords devise, in counsels met thereto:

Against the Lord: with false accord, against his Christ they go.

We could still learn much from this today!

I play two chorale preludes based on *O Traurigkeit* (see Hymn #173), Johann Rist's early 17th century is also a devotional hymn on the crucified Christ. Hermann Schroeder (German, 1904-1984) was composer, conductor, organist and church musician (and, yes, I would like to think that we are releated!). Healey Willan (British, 1880-1968) was composer, organist and church musician. After emigrating to Toronto

in 1913, Willan went on to influence generations of Canadian church musicians.

The Choir sings a portion of to-day's Psalm 51 set to music by Thomas Attwood (English, 1765-1838). Attwood was organist at St. Paul's Cathedral and later at The Chapel Royal. As a teenager he studied in Italy and Vienna with Mozart. We go forth into the world singing the broad hymn, Hail, thou once despised Jesus! with its uplifting text to Christ the King. If you look at the tune name, In Babilone (in italics at the bottom of the page) the source translates as "Old and new Dutch peasant songs and country dances" Amsterdam, 1710.

How delightful!
