

Today's Music

The lilting preludes and communion voluntary were written by David Cherwien (American, b. 1957) a church musician and composer from the Midwest who studied with Paul O. Manz and Alice Parker. Susan Palo Cherwien (American, b. 1953) is a poet and hymn writer (also the wife of David Cherwien): she wrote the text for the hymn, O blessed spring, which Robert Buckley Farlee (American, b. 1950) set to music and gave the tune the name, Berglund, his mother's maiden name. Today the Choir sings the lovely anthem setting of this text and tune, based on the Gospel reading we hear today from John 15.

Our stirring entrance hymn, We know that Christ is raised and dies no more was written in 1969 by John Geyer, a British Congregational minister in order to meet the need for more hymns celebrating our baptismal covenant. It is matched with the soaring tune, Engelberg, by Charles Villiers Stanford (Dublin, 1852-1924) a true lion of church music who was organist, composer and professor. We love to sing this tune so much that we have it in the hymnal three times! (#296, #420, #477). As the sequence hymn we sing the brief and yet profound text by the English mystic, priest and poet, George Herbert (1593-1633). The music is by Ralph Vaughan Williams (English, 1872-1958) who studied with Charles Villiers Stanford. Vaughan Williams wrote the tune, named for Herbert's poem, The Call, as part of his Five Mystical Songs for baritone, chorus and orchestra in 1911. It works beautifully as a congregational hymn.

During communion we sing a jubilant Easter text by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), written on the anniversary of the birth of his wife, October 12, 1755 (what a lovely birthday present!) The tune, *Middlebury*, first appeared in the second edition of the shape-note tunebook *A Supplement to the Kentucky Harmony* (Harrisonburg, VA, 1821-1824). As with many early American tunes, the melody was in **the Tenor**, with harmonizing voices above and below. We have be-

come used to having the melody on the top, or soprano line; this version is written in that style.

We go forth into the world with the easy-to-sing and well-loved tune, *Hyfrydol*, by Rowland Hugh Prichard (Welsh, 1811-1887) written when he was only twenty years old! It is easy to sing because it has a range of only six notes, so most folks can sing it! This text is by Charles Wesley as well. The postlude by Paul O. Manz (American, 1919-2009) is based on this tune. To round out the connections, David Cherwien studied composition with Manz.

May you go forth singing (or humming, or whistling....)
