

Youth Group Meeting

St. Thomas' high school students begin meeting weekly with Rev. Lisa in the library today following the 9:30 service discussion about faith and what it means to be a Christian today.

Today's Music

Today's lilting prelude was written by the English organist, conductor and composer, Sydney Watson (1903-1991). We enter worship singing the stirring German harvest/planting hymn, We plow the fields and scatter the good seed on the land. Text and tune were both written late 18th century; the emphatic unison singing for the opening statement is from William Henry Monk's 1868 harmonization and what we sing today.

Our sequence hymn has a robust tune, Vineyard Haven, written by Dr. Richard Wayne Dirksen (1921-2003), one of the Episcopal church's most distinguished musicians, organists and prolific composers, who was Organist/ Choirmaster at the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul (Washington National Cathedral). The tune is in c minor and has a modal (think plainchant) quality to it and is sing-able with a folk like character. The text is from another time indeed: The text is by Isaac Watts (1674-1748) who is considered the creator of the modern English hymn (we have sixteen of his hymns in our The Hymnal 1982!).

The Choir sings If ye love me, a text from today's Gospel reading in a setting by Thomas Tallis (English, c. 1505-1585). Another giant in church music, Tallis is considered the father of English church music. He was organist, then appointed "Gentleman of the Chapel Royal," a post he remained in until his death. This is an astounding feat since Tallis was Roman Catholic and served under four Tudor monarchs (without losing his head!) He wrote Latin church music as well as music for the Church of England; songs, music for strings and keyboard, and a tremendous amount of church music including anthems, hymns, masses, motets, canticles, settings for morning and evening prayer, psalms....you get the picture! We have six of his hymns in The Hymnal 1982: #'s 25, 43, 170, 692, 260 and 489.

During communion we sing Shepherd of souls, refresh and bless, a text by James Montgomery (1771-1854) from the 1826 Moravian hymnal. John Bacchus Dykes (1823-1876) composed this tune for the hymn Jesus, the very thought of thee, which we have as hymn #642 with a different tune. Richard Proulx (American, 1937-2010) arranged this hymn to have more interesting, singable, bass, tenor and alto parts. Thank you, Richard!

The communion voluntary I play, based on this hymn, is by the lion (lioness?) of American church music, Emma Lou Diemer (b. 1927) who as a recitalist and composer has championed many contemporary composers' works. She has composed extensively for many genres and is still composing full speed at the tender age of 91!

With acknowledgement of Rogation Days and the blessing of the crops, we go forth singing O Jesus, crowned with all renown, a text for this purpose written by Archbishop Edward White Benson (English, 1829-1896). Ralph Vaughan Williams (English, 1872-1958) heard this folk tune in the village of Kingsfold (hence the tune name) and paired it with today's text. (This tune is known in Ireland as The Star of the County Down.) Tunes do get around! Johann Sebastian Bach's (German, 1685-1750) postlude is based on the 16th century German Easter hymn, On earth has dawned this day of days which you can see at Hymn #201. The tune is once again modal (not in a major or minor key) and Bach does it proud with an exuberant dance-like setting. Thank you, Johann!
