

Today's Music

Mit Freuden zart, the tune name of our entrance hymn, is an exuberant, joyful (Freude = Joy) tune which was called Bohemian Brethren in hymnals up through 1940. It first appeared as a French secular song around 1530; then it pops up as a hymn tune in Geneva in 1551. The text, however, was written by Walter Russell Bowie in 1928. It contains numerous biblical references, including today's reading from II Corinthians. This is definitely one to sing with gusto! Our sequence hymn might not be as familiar to you: I cannot tell you how many times someone tells me "I have never seen that hymn before!"

In order for us to avoid getting into a rut by singing the same 50 hymns year in year out, I keep really detailed records of the hymns we have sung over the past twelve years, so I can assure you we have sung it before. *Rejoice, the Lord is King!* is a collaboration between Charles Wesley (the text) and George Frederick Handel (the tune). We know that towards the end of his life Handel



collaborated with Wesley; however, nothing was published at that time. What is incredible and delightful is that Wesley's son, Samuel, the composer and organist, discovered his father's manuscript at the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge, sometime before 1826, when the younger Wesley published three such hymns. I do love the fascinating, circuitous routes which hymns take, especially the tunes!

Frederick L. Hosmer (1840-1929) wrote this hymn for commencement at Meadville Theological School, Meadville, PA on June 12, 1891. The text remains very fresh today. It is paired with the tune, St. Flavian, is from The Whole Book of Psalms, published in 1598, as a setting for Psalm 132. You can look up the original tune in our hymnal at #332. We also sing this tune during Lent: see Hymn #142, Lord, who throughout these forty days. We go forth into the world singing the rousing hymn, God is working his purpose out, written by Arthur C. Ainger at Eton in 1894. Martin Shaw (English, 1875-1958), composer, arranger, organist, wrote this tune, Purpose, especially for this text. Another one to sing with gusto!

The Choir sings the refreshing text by Joshua Smith (New Hampshire, 1784), *Jesus Christ the Apple Tree*. Elizabeth Poston (English, 1905-1987) was a composer, arranger, editor and folksong collector. There are many musical settings of this text: I find the one by Elizabeth Poston especially fresh and fitting for Smith's text. Today I play particularly luxuriant organ music by Charles Marie Widor (French, 1844-1937) and Josef Rheinberger (German, 1839-1901). Both were organists as well as composers: Widor was an incredible improviser and Rheinberger was a much sought-after conductor. Eric H. Thiman (English, 1900-1975) was organist, professor of music, organizer of singing groups and prolific composer. Enjoy!
