

# Today's Music Pentecost 12 August 12, 2018

This past week I learned two important lessons from a 7:30 a.m. parishioner whom I put in the category of "salt of the earth." Last week we sang hymn #414, God, my king, thy might confessing to the tune, Stuttgart. I assumed this tune was familiar to the folks at the 7:30 a.m. service since the tune appears three times in the Hymnal 1982. I had already checked in the Hymnal 1940, which many folks grew up with; that hymnal also has the tune, Stuttgart. However, the one we sang, #414, had a descant written above the **hymn**. I truly appreciate that if you have not sung in a church choir you would never know about the descants and how they are laid out. I did a cursory look through the Hymnal 1940 and found **no descants**. Choir directors had lots of resources (as we do today) for descants to be sung by sopranos, usually on the final stanza of a hymn. It is confusing when there's a stanza above the line you were to sing! I'll keep that in mind.

Second lesson: I have written much about the history of hymn

tunes and hymn texts as well as the anthems or solos we do as offertories and the music I play. However, I have not spoken much about how I choose the hymns and the music! We have a three-year Sunday lectionary cycle and I have resources which help direct me to hymns, anthems, solos and organ music reflecting each Sunday's readings. Today the text of our entrance hymn, #307, Lord, enthroned in heavenly splendor, underscores the Gospel lesson from John 6. This text pays homage to Christ and was written by George H. Bourne (English, 1840-1925). A story surrounds the origins of the hymn tune, Brvn Calfaria: it is said that the tune came to the composer, William Owen (Bangor, North Wales, 1813-1883) on his way to the quarry where he worked. He attended local music classes and went on to conduct and compose (all while working in the quarry). Snubbed by the "cultivated" musicians of his day, this tune was slightly re-worked by Ralph Vaughan Williams to make it more accessible and singable.

Jeffrey Conrad sings Ralph Vaughan Williams' setting of George Herbert's (English1593-1633) mystical poem, *Come, my Way, my Truth, my Life.* Vaughan Williams composed *Five Mystical Songs* (using Herbert's poetry) for baritone, chorus and orchestra in 1911. This song is #4 in the set and is the only one which does not involve the chorus. We are fortunate to have a hymn version of this at #487. (We sang it on April 29<sup>th</sup> of this year.)

We go forth into the world singing another hymn which reflects the Gospel reading from John 6: #335, *I am the bread of life*. This stirring text and soaring tune were both written in 1966 by the Roman Catholic church musician, Suzanne Toolan (American, b. 1927). It has appeared in most mainstream church hymnals and is frequently requested by parishioners. However, it is challenging to fit in the words of the text on the verses (not the refrain). So, do not feel badly if you are strug-

gling with the words: just sing with gusto on the refrain!
