Here's what I'd like us to *try*: the people on our prayer list will still be listed in Tidings each week. *PLEASE TAKE THIS HOME-* and pray the list either alone or with family. It would be lovely to pray it daily, if you are able or as many times in the week as you can. Really think about each person as you pray for them. My goal is not to pray less for our people, but to pray more.

On Sundays for the next couple of months there will be periods of quiet after each petition. I *encourage you to please say aloud* the names of those you would like to pray for. I would love to hear a ripple of names coming forth from our people, for our people. Don't be shy. I'll be saying people's names, too. I'm hoping that a commitment to praying daily for the people on our prayer list, combined with spontaneous prayer on Sunday's will move our hearts in a way that reading a list of names sometimes doesn't.

Please join me for the next couple of months in this *Prayer Experiment*. Pray daily, lift up names aloud on Sunday. Lisa+

# Second Service at 10:00 am, beginning October 7



## Today's Music Pentecost 18 Sunday, September 23, 2018

We enter singing the vigorous hymn, Sing praise to God who reigns above, written by Johann Jakob Schütz (German, 1640-1690) who was an attorney as well as crafter of hymns. It is paired with the equally vigorous tune, *Mit Freuden zart,* first published in 1566. The sequence hymn was written four hundred years later! The Presbyterian minister and poet Frank von Christierson wrote this direct, simple hymn in 1975 and Carl Schalk wrote the tune for this text in 1979.

When I survey the wondrous cross. Isaac Watts (1674-1748) wrote this classic well-loved hymn text based

on Galations 6:14. Edward Miller (1731 -1807) published the tune in 1790: we have been singing this hymn for over two hundred years. *Praise to the Lord, the Almighty*: text written by Joachim Neander (1650-1680) was published in 1680 and the tune, *Lobe den Herren,* has been paired with it for the 300 years since then. The postlude by the American composer Emma Lou Diemer (b. 1927) is based on this tune.

The Choir sings the poignant poem by George Herbert (Welsh, 1593-1630), *Love (3)*. Jackson wrote this (it remains unpublished) for Polly Chatfield's family to sing around the piano. The Choir has made this our own and sings it as such. Thank you, Polly and Jackson, from the bottom of our hearts!

The tune *Rockingham* appears 3 times in each service! I love all the different interpretations composers give to hymn tunes. Charles Hubert Hastings Parry (English, 1848-1918) wrote the organ setting of this tune. Parry was truly a renaissance man: squire, magistrate, author, amateur scientist, teacher, composer, organist, yachtsman et alia! During communion I play Healey Willan's (British, 1880-1968) setting of Rockingham. Willan emigrated to Toronto to teach at the Conservatory of Music and become organist of the newly complete St. Paul's, Canada's largest Anglican church. He had a long career as organist and choir director at the much smaller Church of St. Mary Magdalene until his death. Willan compose the anthem (*O Lord, our Governeur*) for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II.
