

Costume pieces are available in paper bags for each character, and everyone-- children and adults-- are encouraged to participate. Is your child nervous to take a part? Parents are encouraged to come up with them!

Come and be a tree, a star, an angel, a cow, a shepherd...the choice is yours. The narrator tells the story and lets everyone know what to do. This pageant draws in the

Today's Music

Confession: I **love** Advent! We have such beautiful Advent hymns, chants, anthems, music for organ; as well as the beautiful blue vestments; as well as the quieter, more contemplative aspect of Advent as we await and anticipate the birth of Jesus. Today I play three different composers pieces based on the wonderful, classic German chorale, *Wachet auf, ruft uns die Stimme* (Sleepers, wake! A voice astounds us!). Philipp Nicolai (1556-1608) wrote both text and music while

pastor during a terrible epidemic in 1597-1598 when he wound up burying up to thirty parishioners daily. And yet, what a song of hope! Johann Gottfried Walther (German, 1684-1748) befriended Johann Sebastian Bach while they were both in Weimar (1708-1714). The communion voluntary is by Walther. The closing movement of Bach's *Cantata 140* is based on this chorale. Bach himself arranged this for organ; that it what I play as the postlude.

Each week, at the 9:30 service, a member of the Choir will sing once stanza of *O come*, *O come*, *Emmanuel*. (At 7:30 we will all sing one stanza each week.) The tune is traced to a 15th Century Processional of French Franciscan nuns. The text is from the Eighth Century "O Antiphons." What we sing are not the antiphons themselves, but the petitions found at the end. No matter: we have been singing these texts and tune for a very long time!

We enter worship singing Charles Wesley's (1707-1788) broad Advent hymn, Lo! He comes, with clouds descending. Wesley himself published this text with the tune, Helmsley, in 1765: another Advent hymn we have been singing for a long time! Wesley attributed the tune to Thomas Olivers; however, Olivers claimed to have overheard the tune and perhaps it is therefore "borrowed" it from Thomas Arne. Another example of the interesting lives these hymns have!

During communion we sing the eighth century Advent hymn, *Creator of the stars of night*, with John Mason Neale's (1818-1866) sensitive translation. The lovely 12th or 13th century plainchant tune has also traveled through many centuries and traditions. We go forth into the world singing the exuberant Advent text by Laurentius Laurenti (1660-1722) paired with the late 19th century Welsh tune, *Llangloffan*. Some scholars thought that this tune comes from the English folk song *The Jolly Miller of Dee*. (!) and that the tune migrated to Wales! We have Ralph Vaughan Williams' harmonization of this tune at EH #607.

The Choir sings The Rev. John Thornburg's text with such powerful imagery about all Three Persons of the Holy Trinity. Gerre Hancock (American, 1934-2012) composed the soaring music.
