



Christmas Flowers

Christmas flower donations are now being accepted. These can be in memory of a loved one or in honor of or in thanksgiving for someone or some place. Specially marked envelopes have been placed in the pew racks for your use.

Today's Music

What is the meaning of all these "S" numbers? This designates that it is Service Music (e.g., Gloria, Trisagion, Kyrie, Sanctus, etc.) The hymnals we have in our pews have only the hymns. This is why we have to use the *pew cards*, those laminated half-page sheets

we put in the hymnals in the pews. Each time we move into a different season of the liturgical year and we change the service music, we have to remove the pew cards and replace them with the new one. It is labor-intensive! Some folks have *The Hymnal 1982*; that is why we include the S-102, S-120, S-114 and S-158 numbers should they want to look up the Service Music, mark those pages, and sing from their hymnals.

Freu dich sehr is the 17th century German tune which is the basis for today's prelude by Johann Pachelbel (German, 1653-1706) as well as the communion voluntary by Sigfrid Karg-Elert (German, 1877-1933). Next week we will sing this tune in Hymn 67, Comfort, comfort ye my people; it is another widely traveled hymn tune which made its way via The Genevan Psalter and Louis Bourgeois (1510-1561)who is the probable composer/arranger. The tune name in our hymnal is also reflective of this: Psalm 42.

Ed Shindle sings an exquisite song, Prayer, which started life as a poem by Mikhail Lermontov (Russian, 1814-1841), was translated into German, then set to music by Franz Liszt (Hungarian, 1811-1886). Our entrance hymn, On Jordan's bank the Baptist's cry, is probably one of the most widely used Advent hymns. The text was written by Charles Coffin (1676-1749) as an Advent text: the tune started out in Germany in 1690, made its way across the pond where John Wesley included it in a 1742 publication, then bounced around as a tune in triple meter (3 beats to a measure, which apparently was favored by the Methodists), then taken up by William Henry Havergal, which is mostly the version we sing today. Whew!

Herald, sound the note of judgment, our sequence hymn, is an exciting text which underscores not only the message from the Gospel of Mark, but Isaiah and 2 Peter too. Robert J. Powell (American, b. 1932) created an equally exciting tune for this. During communion we sing a 10th century Advent hymn, O heavenly Word, eternal Light; using the 12th century French plainchant, Verbum supernum prodiens. The postlude by Gerald Near (American, b. 1942) sounds out this plainchant very loudly on the organ trumpets. A truly fitting way to bring this worship on the Second Sunday in Advent to a close!
