
Tidings

Today's Music October 21, 2018

The dulcet prelude is by Marcel Dupré (French, 1886-1971). Dupré was a phenomenal organist and improviser who studied with Guilmant, Vierne and Widor. In 1934 he succeeded Widor as organist at St. Sulpice in Paris, a post he held until his death. He traveled extensively as a performer and managed to be a prolific composer as well. Emma Lou **Diemer** (American, b. 1927) based the lilting piece I play during communion on one of the old hymns, Come, ye disconsolate, which we had in The Hymnal 1940 (unfortunately did not make it into our current The Hymnal 1982.) Many of you probably remember the tune. And, for the postlude, I am delighted to be playing music new to me. (It is based on the hymn we sing during communion.) George Shearing (English, 1919-2011)

was a jazz musician who is credited with composing *The Lullaby of Birdland*, played piano with his own quintet and performed with many of the great jazz legends. Born blind to a working class family, neither of these things hindered his pursuing his talents. I discovered his music for organ at one of our American Guild of Organists, Bangor Chapter, "music swaps!" You will hear more of Shearing's music in the coming weeks.

The Choir sings Washington Gladden's (American, 1836-1918) very personal poem, O Master let me walk with thee, which Dr. Charles H. Richards made into a hymn. The musical setting is by the late Calvin Hampton (American, 1938-1984) an absolute cracker jack (that's a compliment) organist, improviser and performer who gave midnight recitals at Calvary Church, NYC while organist there. The recitals were standing room only! Dr. Vernon deTar was the consummate church musician. (Both Margaret Peet and I studied with deTar while we pursued graduate degrees in The School of Sacred Music at Union Theological Seminary in NYC). DeTar was a great proponent of new music, so when he had his choir at Church of the Ascension (NYC) sing Hampton's as yet unpublished hymn, it and Hampston's music gained recognition. Hampton named the tune after deTar.

As the sequence hymn we sing Dakota Indian hymn, *Many and great, O God, are thy works,* which is a powerful witness of unwavering faith in God while in the midst of great persecution. From a sermon by the Rev. Abraham Crawford, pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Flandreau, South Dakota, we learn that 38 Dakota Indians were executed on December 26, 1862. This hymn of praise is what the men sang as they

marched to their deaths. Many had converted to Christianity while being ministered to by missionaries in prison. For me, this hymn resonates with Job's steadfast faith in tribulation.

The tune for our communion hymn is called *Restoration*, and it is traced to the collection, *The Southern* Harmony, published in New Haven, CT, 1835. As is typical for many of the early Sacred Harp or shape-note tunes. it went through many, many iterations! This is the tune George Shearling used to create today's postlude.

May you go forth with many tunes!
