
Tidings Sunday, January 6, 2019 The Feast of Epiphany

Today's Music

The Feast of the Epiphany January 6, 2019

How delightful when Epiphany falls on a Sunday and we can celebrate this feast royally! (All puns intended). Today's prelude was written in 1961 based on chants for Epiphany by the French composer, organist and teacher Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986). Although thought of as an 'ancient' carol, our entrance hymn, We three kings of Orient are, has both words and music written in 1857 by the American music teacher (he taught at our General Theological Seminary in NYC) John Henry Hopkins, Jr. Our sequence hymn, How bright appears the Morning Star, is considered the "Queen of Chorales" alongside the "King of Chorales," Wake, awake, for night is flying (#61 in our hymnal). Both were written by Philipp Nicolai (1556-1608) and bookend Advent and Epiphany.

The Choir sings Benjamin Britten's (English, 1913-1976) setting of the anonymous text *A New Year Carol*. Walter de la Mare (English, 1873-1956) found the text: and yet we still do not know the origins! *Levy-Dew is* possibly a British folk song of Welsh origin meaning 'a cry to God;' possibly Middle English 'Lady' or possibly French 'raise to God.' There is an ancient tradition of taking 'new' water from a well and sprinkling it on doorways for a fresh start (we use *asperges* to sprinkle holy water on the altar and on people....) I leave you to draw your own conclusions.

Sam Batt Owens (American, 1928 -1998) was organist, choir director, college professor as well as composer of well-crafted sacred music. Today's communion voluntary by him is based on the chant we will then sing during communion, *Of the Father's Love begotten* (chant name: *Divinum mysterium*). The text was written in the Fourth Century and the chant is from the Middle Ages: Christians have been singing this a very long time, so let us join the throng!

Reginald Heber (English, 1783-1826) wrote the stirring hymn we go forth into the world singing, *Brightest and best of the stars of the morning*, as part of his efforts to improve congregational singing in his parish(!) The tune was written by James Proctor Harding (1850-1911) as a choir anthem, and has been adapted as a congregational hymn. Then I play Dietrich Buxtehude's chorale prelude on the chant *Puer nobis* by Michael Praetorius' (see Hymn #124). Not enough room to sing it today!

We have sung much about the star: go forth with its guiding light!
