

Free Farmers Market Tuesday, February 5

Come to South School on the first Tuesday of every month from 11:00AM to 3:30PM and help yourself to some FREE produce! Produce is different every month but, since the program started, they've had apples, cantelope, nectarines, grapes, mushrooms, green peppers, potatoes, lettuce, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, cucumbers, onions, and more. They generally have around 1,250 pounds to distribute.

There is enough for EVERYONE and the program is for EVERYONE. It is not need-based. This is important because oftentimes there is a stigma perceived in accepting something for free. They want to remove that stigma.

We ALL need and deserve fresh, healthy food and there will be plenty for everyone! Each month there has been food left over for further distribution.

Volunteers are needed to be on hand for the arrival of the produce and for setting up the market. If you are available, please arrive by 11:00 AM to help set up.

Today's Music February 3, 2019

Fourth Sunday after Epiphany

We are still in the season of Epiphany, so it is fitting that I play two of **Gerald Near's** (American, b. 1942) Introits on plainchant. (Introits are pieces of music sung or played at the beginning of a worship service.) During Communion I play **Paul Manz's** piece on *Let all mortal flesh keep silence* (Hymn 324) which we may or may not have sung on Sunday, January 20th due to 'weather!' Manz (American, 1919-2009) was a major figure in American church music as a composer, performer, teacher, organist, improviser and enthusiastic organizer of choral festivals. The joyful postlude is by **Jacques Berthier** (French, 1923-1994). Both his parents were musicians. In 1955 the monastic community at **Taizé** asked Berthier to compose songs for the many young people who were making pilgrimages there. Berthier wound up writing over two hundred chants and songs which are now used around the world in services. He had the unique talent of writing chants that were easily learned after hearing only a few times; that were able to be repeated numerous times without becoming tedious; and that were good musically!

We enter worship singing the rousing hymn text written in 1928 by **Walter Russell Bowie** (American, 1882-1969). It is paired brilliantly with the 16th century tune of both German/French heritage, *Mit Freuden zart* and harmonized by Ralph Vaughan Williams. Our communion hymn was written in mid-nineteenth century Germany as a mission hymn and sung to a sometimes called *four-square* tune (just listen to it!) from early eighteenth century Germany and adapted and harmonized by William H. Havergal. These hymns do get around! We go forth into the world singing another stirring hymn, *God the Omnipotent!* The text is a combo of words by Henry F. Chorley and John Ellerton. The music, which you may recognize as the Russian National Anthem, was composed by **Alexis Lvov** (Russian, 1799-1870). Lvov was a talented musician, became an engineer, and was appointed as an aide to **Tsar Nicholas I**. At court, Lvov organized weekly concerts and considered among his friends Franz Liszt, Clara and Robert Schumann, Hector Berlioz and Felix Mendelssohn.

And not once did I use the word “gusto!”
