

Singing Opportunity for Children

Bonnie Achterhof will again be offering an opportunity for children to sing together after the services today. Children who would like to participate will follow her after Communion to the Green Room where they will sing for about 20 minutes.

Today's Music

This morning we come full circle and bring the church year to a close; this means next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent!

The Choir sings Gustav Holst's (English, 1874-1934) expansive anthem setting of *Let all mortal flesh keep silence*. The text was part of the 5th century Liturgy of St. James, used at the presentation of the sacred elements at the time of the offertory. Ralph Vaughan Williams (English, 1872-1958) had another of his strokes of genius when he matched this

text with the 17th century French folk tune, *Picardy*. (See it in our hymnal #324). Holst originally scored this for reeds, horns, timpani, organ and strings. We will do our best to fill out the parts and sing it with vigor! I play two very different organ pieces based on the lovely 16th century German chorale, *Lord, thee I love with all my heart*. Sigfrid Karg -Elert (German, 1877-1933) wrote the luxuriant prelude based on this tune and Paul Manz (American, 1919-2009) composed the lovely setting I play during communion. Emma Lou Diemer (American, b. 1927) composed the exultant postlude based on the hymn we sing as we enter worship.

The sequence hymn, King of glory, King of peace has the exquisite 17th century text by the priest/poet George Herbert with music written by 20th century priest/musician, David Charles Walker (American, b. 1938). At the offertory hymn, we have the pairing of Isaac Watts' (English, 1674-1748) text, Come, we that love the Lord, with Dr. Richard Wayne Dirksen's stirring tune, Vineyard Haven, composed for the 1974 installation of the new Presiding Bishop at Washington Cathedral (where Dirksen was Organist & Choirmaster). During communion we sing the medieval Irish hymn, Draw nigh and take the Body of the Lord sung to the tune, Song 46 by Orlando Gibbons (English, 1583-1625).

Going forth into the world we sing *All hail the power of Jesus' Name!* has both a text which appeared (and then evolved greatly!) in the late 18th century and has been paired with Oliver Holden's tune, *Coronation*, since 1793.

Sing with gusto!
