

All Saints Sunday Is Coming Up 1

Several things will be happening on that Feast Day:

- This year we're asking that people bring in pictures of people close to them who have died this year to put on one of two tables set up in the church and one in the narthex (if needed). Framed or unframed is fine. We will have candles lit on all tables.
- We will offer the Eucharist in honor of those who have died from our congregation during the year, and I will say them all by name.
- We will have a "necrology": a short blessing and reading of the names of all those buried in our columbarium since it began.
 That will take place between the services instead of my class.

After both services we will have coffee hour, offered in thanksgiving for the lives of our beloved departed. At the reception after the 10:00 service we will give thanks for the life of Jean Harper, who was buried privately a few weeks ago in our columbarium. Please join us as we celebrate the lives of those who have gone on before us. —*Lisa* +

Wayfinders Teams Forming

Want to have FUN connecting your faith to your Monday-Saturday life? Come join a Wayfinders team at St. Thomas' this winter!

Wayfinders is a program which encourages every Christian to listen to where God might be calling them next, and then — crucially — supports them as they take steps to answer that call.

Wayfinders is in two parts. First, you'll attend a weekend retreat with your teammates to listen for God's voice, asking yourself, "Where is God calling me next at this particular moment in my life?"

Because everyone is at a different place in life, people's answers can be as varied as "finally balancing my checkbook" to "joining the fight against human trafficking." Some teammates have been called to write a book, or join a band, or join (or start!) a ministry that has tugged at their heart. Other Wayfinders who are going through a rough patch have discerned with God a need to take some Sabbath time.

Once you have discerned your goal, that's where the action begins! In the second part of Wayfinders, you and your teammates will get together for eight meetings to give each other accountability and support as you take steps between meetings to bring your own "holy goals" to life.
