

Flu Safety in Church

Flu season is upon us, so here are flu protocol suggestions from our diocese: Rather than shaking hands, pass the Peace by bowing to each other. The safest approach to communion is to receive the bread only. Communion in one kind —receiving only the bread or the wine is considered a complete communion. The Episcopal Church believes that receiving in one kind is as if you are receiving in both. "Intinction" is also an option. If you intinct, make sure your fingers do not touch the wine, otherwise you spread germs to the common cup. Let's have a healthy flu season!
