

Why Is Jesus in the Crèche?

Some Episcopal churches leave the baby Jesus out of the crèche until Christmas Eve, as a sign that Jesus isn't yet born. One could argue that Mary and Joseph haven't gotten to Bethlehem yet, either — but that's another article. Last year several people from around town asked me if the Episcopal Church believes in Jesus, after noticing that Christ was not in the manger at our church. It got me thinking about the impression our church unintentionally gives to the town. Are we welcoming, or are there "secret handshakes" (like a Jesus-less crèche) that can make people hesitate before attending St. Thomas'?

This year, we have the whole holy family together. I know some won't like the change, but let's try it this Advent. Next year, if I've gotten lots of pushback, perhaps we could have Mary and Joseph travel around the lawn, until all THREE get to the crèche on Christmas Eve? That would get people's attention! Or we could erect a friendly sign, explaining why we do what we do. Together, let's figure out a way to engage meaningfully —not just with each other — but with our town. Flu Prevention

Flu season is upon us, so here are suggestions to help limit the spread of germs: Rather than shaking hands, consider passing the Peace by bowing to each other. The safest approach to communion is to receive the bread only. Communion in one kind receiving only the bread is the same as receiving both, in theological terms. If you must intinct, please be careful to dip only the edge of the host into the wine. It is important that your fingers do not touch the wine, otherwise you spread germs to the common cup. Parents, you might want to play the "Eucharist game" at home to show your kids how to do this! Thank you for your extra care this flu season. It will help to protect the youngest and the oldest, and those with compromised immune systems.

SCAM Alert
