

Join in the Great Litany If you want to see our church at its ritualistically best, come and participate in the Great Litany.

This liturgical rite has been used by Christians since the fifth century. The Great Litany is done on the first Sunday in Lent –March 1 this year. It is sometimes chanted in a procession, and sometimes it is said. This Litany includes various petitions that are led by the priest and/or cantor with responses sung or said by the congregation. The Great Litany invokes the Trinity and includes prayers for deliverance from evil, spiritual harm, and natural calamities; and concludes with prayers of general intercession. The Great Litany replaces the Prayers of the People and the Confession on Lent 1.



Can You Sit With Me for One Hour?

This year we would like to try a new thing (or perhaps an old thing...) After the Maundy Thursday service, we would like to invite people to sit in vigil for one hour in the chapel with the reserved sacrament from the end of the service (approximately 7:00 p.m.) throughout the night, until the next morning, Good Friday—just as the disciples tried to stay awake with Jesus. You can wander the chapel and church, you can read, you can sit quietly or pray. There will be two slots for each hour, and we encourage people to fill all the slots. Please respect the quiet while sitting with the other people sitting in vigil. I will be doing a short liturgy of the hours at midnight, and again at 6:00 a.m. The vigil concludes at 9:00 a.m. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex and in the Sun Room throughout Lent.
