During the month of June, our plan is to have Sunday services in a format such as the Diocese uses: with people singing and reading or doing the prayers from home, and doing the "spiritual" Eucharist from the church with Clarissa on the organ and the Rector celebrating and preaching. If you would like to participate by video, you will need a camera or phone that supports video with sound, and be willing to learn how to upload it to the person pulling it all together. If that sounds like something you would love to try, please let the office or the Rector know by email. It would be nice to see more of our adults and children participate in the service.
