

We are also looking for a couple of people to lead Compline on Saturdays in July at 8:00 p.m. This service is a little longer—it runs approximately 15 minutes and is one of the loveliest services in the prayer book. If you are interested in this ministry, please contact the Rector.

St. Peter's Loaves & Fishes Update

Recently, the vestry and Rector Lael Sorensen at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Rockland have been studying how to move forward with the weekend community lunch program in a safe, newly modified format that would allow guests to be seated in the parish

hall rather than only receiving takeout at the door.

Starting in August, just 18 people will be allowed in and they will be required to wear masks until they begin eating. No more than three people will be seated at each round table. Ron Staschak has volunteered to wash tablecloths after each meal and will stand sentry at the entrance to ensure mask wearing and assess individuals' health before they enter.

Meals will be served on cafeteria trays that guests will bring back to their table. They may come up to receive food only once, although takehome leftovers will still be available. No coffee service will be offered.

Thanks go to Ron and to Jim Bowditch for gathering feedback and suggestions from each team involved in this ministry, before making any decisions on how to proceed.

As the weather once again becomes cooler, the warmth of the parish hall will be appreciated as will the community aspect of the meal (albeit socially distanced).

The size of the kitchen serving team will be limited to three, and the new disinfecting cleaning protocols will remain in place — *Pam Bardon*
