#### The Officiant says to the people

Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

Il Saints' Day is one of the great festivals of the Church year celebrating those who have reflected the light of Christ in their own life. Do you have a favorite saint? Are you named after a saint? Who are the people in your life who have introduced you to Christ and nourished your faith by their example? Saint Paul refers to all the baptized as "saints". Whether you think of yourself as a saint or not, you are baptized into the way of Jesus. On **the Sunday After All Saints' Day, November 2**, we will renew our baptismal vows at both services. At 10 o'clock, we will receive Violet Groman into the household of God through the Sacrament of Baptism. How will you support Violet into this new life and help her grow into the full stature of Christ?

On this day, we make our financial commitment to support the work of Jesus Christ through the ministries of St. Thomas' Church. Everything we have: our family, our health, talents, and income are gifts from God. Will you offer a percentage of your income to support the life changing work of God's redeeming work? We will meet between the services at 9 a.m. as one community to celebrate the harvest of transformed lives that God is bringing about in our midst. A smorgasbord of homemade pies will be laid out to enjoy with fellow parishioners and we will receive an update on our 2026 pledge campaign. "All things come of thee, O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee."

Remembering the saints of our lives, I invite you to bring photographs of those who are now living in the fullness of God's presence. You may place them on a table in the Lady Chapel and if you wish, you may leave their photos there until November 23 (please remove them on or before that day). A large book will be nearby to inscribe names of those whom we wish to remember. It too will be available in the Chapel from November 1 through November 23 and you may inscribe names of deceased friends and relatives at anytime. Pausing to write the name of those we love but see no longer in itself is an act of prayer, deepening our assurance of eternal life.

We will also pray for those who are buried in All Souls' Memorial Garden located by the statue of St. Thomas; follow the procession outside at the end of the 8 a.m. Eucharist. Plan on coming about 8:45 a.m. to join the prayer if you are are coming to the 9 o'clock harvest celebration and later service. "Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord; and let light perpetual shine upon them."
